Dear Friends



What are we giving up for Lent? A question I have heard asked in small groups, in churches and on national media.

Sometimes we switch it around ... **what are we taking on, or doing for Lent?** This second way has seen people take on projects for Lent or raise money for good causes. This, I think, is a better approach as it is more affirming and helpful. However, I find myself asking – what has this to do with Jesus and our journey with God? If we should do or not do something – should it be anytime or all the time?

Yet this Lent I have been delighted to see some local churches intentionally give up some things and take on others in order to be more united with each other in the name of Christ.

- On Ash Wednesday there were united and ecumenical Ash Wednesday services in the evening.
- There was also a coming together of a few people from Kingswinford Methodist church, St Mary's Church of England and Kingswinford Christian Centre who met at Townsend Place to offer ashing, blessings and prayers (as well as a list of Easter services) to any who wanted them. It was cold, but dry 👍

I have thought about this in relation to Lent. Here we had a giving up of some barriers which separate us, to take up the centrality of Jesus who unites us to be a visibly more united church (something which Jesus prayed for us just before his arrest and crucifixion).

This is a positive way of being – of becoming closer to God through Jesus in the uniting power of the Spirit who calls us through grace to unity and love within our walls, and without them! Now and always.

Our theme was **Love is All Around** - well it was just a few days after Valentine's Day! The room was buzzing throughout the morning and -as we shared time crafting, eating, worshipping and playing games - it really did feel as though love was filling the whole of the church.

As usual we made a variety of sweet treats. We decorated doughnuts with a variety of icing and a wide range of heart sweets. They were loaded up and much better than Krispy Kremes.

As usual some of our crafts were messy. The young people decorated heart-shaped keys rings with Sharpie pens and made arty heart designs with pastels. There were wipes at the ready for those who wanted to clean up afterwards.

Finally, we made suncatchers with a heart and cross design and a message, 'Jesus loves me'. Jesus is for all of us so we can reflect his love in all the mess of the world. Recycling in Dudley

Taken from the Dudley Council website:

From 6 April 2026 Dudley Council will be rolling out a new waste and recycling service, to include weekly food waste collections and simplified recycling, to improve recycling rates by making it easier for residents.

All councils must put food waste collections in place by April 2026, under new government legislation being introduced. Recycled food waste is a valuable resource and can be turned into natural forms of energy such as biogas, or fertiliser/soil conditioner for farming.

From early 2026 residents will receive their three new waste containers:

- **a blue wheeled bin** (for mixed recycling: cans, plastic, glass, cartons)
- **kerbside food caddy**
- **smaller kitchen food caddy** – complete with a roll of liners (the kitchen food caddy's contents will be emptied into the larger outdoor kerbside food caddy for collection).

Residents will keep their existing **black bin** – for general waste, along with their **blue recycling bag** for separate paper and card. They will also keep their **green garden bin** if they subscribe to this service.

Food waste will be collected **weekly**

Recycling will be collected **fortnightly** (blue bin and bag)

General waste will be collected **fortnightly** (black bin) – on alternate weeks to recycling collections

Garden waste will be collected **fortnightly** – if subscribed (green bin)

SALMON SOUFFLÉ TART - Judith Tyler

Shortcrust pastry:

6 oz plain flour
3 oz hard margarine or butter
3 tablespoons ice cold water

Filling:

7 oz (213g) tin of red salmon
(mashed/bones removed)
4 oz grated Cheddar cheese
1 oz margarine
1 oz plain flour
¼ pt milk
4 tablespoons natural yoghurt
2 eggs, separated
Salt and pepper

Method:

1. Pre-heat oven (200°C/Gas Mark 6). Place baking sheet in oven.
2. Prepare shortcrust pastry:
Sieve flour into mixing bowl. Cut margarine into small pieces and rub into flour until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Add 3 tablespoons of iced water and stir with a round-bladed knife until the mixture forms a ball. Knead lightly until smooth.
3. Roll out the pastry and line an 8-inch flan tin. Place on pre-heated baking sheet and bake blind for 10 minutes.
4. Make roux sauce:
Melt margarine in small saucepan. Add plain flour and cook for 1 minute (until it resembles grains of sand). Gradually add milk and stir until thickened. Remove from heat.
5. Add mashed salmon, yoghurt, egg yolks, cheese and seasoning.
6. Whisk egg whites until stiff and gently fold into salmon mixture.
7. Pour into part-baked pastry case and continue baking for about 35 minutes.
8. Serve cold.
