## Preparing for Easter

As I look forward to Holy Week, I find myself focusing on the events and people surrounding Palm Sunday. Here are some - Jesus, Mary, Martha, Lazarus, Jesus's disciples, priests and a crowd.



In John's gospel Jesus has just given another sign – by raising Lazarus from the dead. Then there is the meal in his honour, where Mary (Lazarus and Martha's sister) pours expensive perfume on Jesus' feet. The next day Jesus goes into Jerusalem, riding on a donkey and many people in the crowd shout His praises, proclaiming Him as the Messiah!

### **I wonder where I would fit in?**

I would like to think I would be one of the disciples there - a follower of Jesus. Rejoicing that our Rabbi – Jesus – had brought his friend Lazarus back to life. Knowing we have made the RIGHT choice – Jesus IS the Messiah, the special, anointed one of God! But, to be a disciple, I would have to have left what I am comfortable with - my security and familiarity - and walk into the unknown with Jesus.

I hope I would be a disciple, even when the Jesus Way is hard. I think it more likely that I would be in the crowd, where it is easier to hide and 'go with the flow.' On this occasion it would be great – waving palms or coats or flags for Jesus, the champion of God, who even overcame death with Lazarus! We could cheer Him on together – but I wonder what I would say if I found myself in another crowd a few days later, when they shouted '*crucify?*'

Maybe, like Martha, I would prepare and share food for Him; or, like Mary, pour out my precious gift for Him... **Maybe I could just be myself, and share the love He has for me (and each of us)!**

## From the Editor....

Jem asks where would I fit in? This is the second time this week I have had this question (raised initially at Core Bible Study on Monday evening). I appreciate this isn't theological and it is simply a '*Richardisum*' but the idea of dusty, possibly grubby feet being smothered in expensive perfume and human hair used for towelling just does not work for me. However, for me, Pilate's position, like that of Judas, challenges us because their choices were necessary.

Jesus was always going to be crucified so that God's plan - that my sins and selfishness can be washed away - could be realised.

Being human and being in the crowd it would be easy to be swayed by the numbers, but we are blessed with choice and we are told that following God isn't always easy. In times of conflict/hardship this can sometimes, for me, feel like a caveat to my faith.

In sport, I find myself drawn to the underdog. Pilate had all the power and yet he was never going to win – he knew Jesus was innocent, the crowd were baying for Jesus' crucifixion. Even his wife had added her twopenny worth. So, what does he do with his power? He washes his hands of the decision. I know I would not have wanted my feet to fit into his expensive sandals.

So again, where would I fit in? I have the advantage of both hindsight and not having been there. I'd love to be able to say that I would have called out for Jesus' release, but I would probably have just kept my head down. However, without trying to defend my cowardliness, it was God's plan and I am eternally grateful for God's grace and love.

This month we also have reason to be grateful to the Cloke boys for their amazing generosity to the Outreach work of our church – please see the Memory Garden page for a message from them explaining their gift. We remember Beatrice and George with love and will, I'm sure, use their gift with Godly wisdom.

# Core Bible April 2026

We meet at 7.30 pm on Monday evenings in the worship space (lifts are always available). We are always glad to welcome new faces. This group is for everyone—whether you read the Bible daily and can quote multiple verses, or if you pick the Bible up rarely and are not sure what the names of all the books are!

We are an Eco Church, and part of our commitment to this includes studying the Scriptures through an ecological lens. During April and May, our conversation turns to the environment as we explore “*A Christian Guide to Environmental Issues*” by Martin and Margot Hodson. In the foreword to the guide, Andy Atkins - chief executive of A Rocha UK, who founded the Eco Church initiative - gives this incentive to our study and action:

*'Is there hope?' is a question I am often asked. No doubt, the trends in biodiversity loss, climate change, plastics pollution and many other 'environmental' issues are very concerning, not to say potentially catastrophic. But, yes, there is hope. Not just ultimately, in a loving, creator God, but in him now. Churches and Christians are still present in every village, town and neighbourhood in the UK. However stretched we may feel, we have a unique potential to make a positive impact on the environmental crisis locally and nationally if we act together, drawing on the E science and the resources we have.*

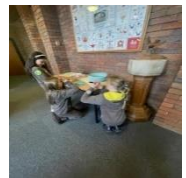

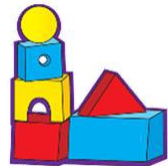
