We must be wary of dominant voices that can end up supressing others and we must seek to speak with grace and to find the good things in other people's ideas.

Above all I want to give thanks for how you have looked after me and Michele and our ministry as we have sought to serve you. I pray that you will do the same for Rev Jem and his family and of course for Rev Michael, Rev Chris and Martyn Filsak, our local lay pastor.

You will always be in my prayers as you live and serve in the name of Christ. God bless you all. Rev Alan

Sunday 31st August – 10.30am Guest Service

On Sunday 31st August we will be hosting Tom Elliot, who is a Christian comedian and magician who uses his work to share his faith. The morning will start with a short time of praise and worship and then we hand over to Tom, who will do his 'set'. His material is suitable for all ages. The morning will finish with an interview about Tom's faith.

Tom describes his work like this,

I tour because Christians need to be bolder in their evangelism style — not just in terms of how they speak the gospel, but in how they invite others to hear it. Many non-Christians are unfamiliar with — perhaps uncomfortable, or simply culturally disconnected from ever stepping into — a church building. The tour is an easy-invite event, which takes the gospel into mainstream theatres in partnership with local churches.

We have received a Circuit Grant to fund this as it is an outreach event – a service to which you are encouraged to invite people that you know who don't normally come to church.

Bags for Refugees...

I was alone as a stranger, and you welcomed Me into your homes and your lives...(Matthew 25:35 The Voice)

Following on from the success of our 'Bags for New Mums' project, and the support we have been giving to Saltbrook Place, the Outreach group would like to do something similar for the local asylum seekers/refugee population, many of whom are children or teenagers.

World events in the past few years mean that many families have resorted to leaving their homes in search of safety within the UK. Government policy ensures that the number of those seeking asylum never exceeds 0.5% of the population of a particular council area. Those classed as refugees, however, are those who have had their asylum application thoroughly investigated and *have proven that they have 'a well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, membership of a particular social group, or political opinion' in their homeland and are afraid to return to that country. Under international law and conventions, they are entitled to protection in another country. Once granted refugee status the individual or family can begin to build a life here. The current population of refugees in the Dudley Borough come from Iran, Iraq, Afghanistan, Congo, Zimbabwe, Somalia, China and Syria. Most come as family units with less than 40% being single people. ¹*

For teenagers in this situation, the issues created are, of course too numerous to mention each one here, but imagine being a boy who has always been taught in single sex classes, suddenly thrown into mixed teaching groups or a girl who never having been allowed to learn science, is excited to try, but daunted as they attempt to "catch up" on 5 years of chemistry using a language they barely know.

Jesus, of course, was thrown into the life of a refugee shortly after his birth when, seeking to escape the murderous Herod, Joseph took the family to the safety of Egypt. In Matthew 25:35, Jesus teaches that whatever we do for a brother or sister in need (which includes strangers), we do for him. So, the plan is simple: to follow the Bags for New Mums pattern and create some bags for teenagers who, through no fault of their own, find themselves as strangers in the foreign land of Dudley Borough schools! To do this, we need your help with donations. There will be a list of items to buy and then donate on the link table from 6th July; this will include items for use in school, such as stationery, but also treats like chocolate and sweets. If you prefer to make a cash donation, these can be given to Melanie or Debbie.

Once created the bags will be gifted through local schools – beginning with one where we know of a significant refugee population and then, if the project proves successful, extending to other schools.

Birthday Celebrations



In May we collected and donated 43.1 kg of food and 2kg of non-food – enough to provide 86 meals and 2 toiletry packs.

We know that through food insecurity, people are often forced to eat low quality food or not enough food, leading to malnutrition. Malnutrition and hunger don't just affect people's physical health, but also their life-chances, self-confidence, and mental well-being. Access to free fresh food can play a role in helping to reduce some of the health inequalities faced by vulnerable people accessing our foodbanks and local community projects. BCFB has offered the 26 foodbanks and local community groups the opportunity to apply for up to £500 worth of funding to purchase fresh food items.




